 - Major Group Turbines transparency increased
 - o Heights amended to read with brackets () around them
- e. Golf course symbols reduced in size
- f. Contours
 - o Only contours from 500ft have been included
- g. Spot Heights
 - A selection of spot heights greater than 700ft have been included within the country as well a selection of some island spot heights
- h. Hypsometric Tints
 - o Changed to the ICAO palette
- i. Isogonals and topographical data amended to 2018 values
- j. VFR Waypoints names added in the Dublin region
- k. Light houses
 - o Elevations and heights added

- m. New Note: This aeronautical chart is intended to aid general air traffic in the conduct of air navigation in visual meteorological conditions. It provides information to satisfy the requirements of air navigation for low speed, short or medium-range operations, at low and intermediate altitudes and is specifically designed for flights operating in compliance with the Standardised European Rules of the Air (SERA). Pilots are reminded that it is the their responsibility to continually assess the aviation risk to third parties, occupants and the aircraft, such that it is proportionate to the purpose of the flight.
