CERTIFICATE OF FITNESS FOR FLIGHT

The Irish Aviation Authority, in pursuance of Articles 7, 25 and 31 of the Irish Aviation Authority (Airworthiness of Aircraft) Order, (S.I. No. 324 of 1996), as amended, hereby directs that:

a record of a certificate of fitness for flight issued under Article 7(3)(i) of the Order and of a report in respect of each such flight shall be prepared and held by the person or maintenance organisation issuing the certificate above and shall be copied to the operator of the aircraft concerned. Such reports shall be made available to the Authority as required and at the time of the certificate of airworthiness renewal inspection for the aircraft concerned.

A certificate of fitness for flight in the format shown in this Notice may be issued in accordance with the limitations of Article 7(3) of the Order. This may occur when in-flight checks are required after aircraft maintenance work or further to the incorporation of a major modification, and before a certificate of release to service may be issued for the aircraft concerned.

The certificate shall be issued in duplicate and one copy kept elsewhere than in the aircraft.

A certificate of fitness for flight may be issued only by the following :-

a person or persons qualified in accordance with the provisions of Article 25 of the Irish Aviation Authority (Airworthiness of Aircraft) Order 1996 (S.I. No. 324 of 1996).

If the original airworthiness condition of the aircraft is affected during the period of validity, the certificate of fitness shall be re-issued.
