CERTIFICATE OF TYPE APPROVAL

The Irish Aviation Authority, in pursuance of Articles 9 and 31 of the Irish Aviation Authority (Airworthiness of Aircraft) Order, 1996, (S.I. No. 324 of 1996), as amended by Irish Aviation Authority (Airworthiness of Aircraft) (Amendment) Order S.I. No. 102 of 1997, as amended by Irish Aviation Authority (Airworthiness of Aircraft) (Amendment) Order S.I. No 684 of 2003, hereby directs that:

Where corresponding and applicable provisions under EU Commission Regulation (EC) No. 1702/2003, do not apply:

1. A certificate of type approval issued by the authority of another state shall be known as a Type Certificate and shall be associated with a corresponding Type Certificate Data Sheet pertinent to the aircraft type(s) or product(s) concerned and containing such factual information concerning the aircraft type and its certification basis as is deemed appropriate by the issuing authority.
2. A Certificate of Airworthiness may not be issued for an Irish registered aircraft unless there exists in respect of the aircraft type and model concerned;
 - a) a Type Certificate issued by the state of design and/or manufacture of that aircraft and
 - b) a standard Type Certificate issued by the state(s) originating the certification code(s) concerned.

which both define its type certification basis in accordance with the relevant requirements of Aeronautical Notice No. A1 at latest issue and in respect of which a standard category (i.e. non-restricted/non-special) certificate of airworthiness may be issued in the state of design and/or manufacture or in the state(s) which has originated the certification code forming its type certification basis.

3. In respect of the type certification basis defined in paragraph 2, the applicable emissions requirements contained in 21A.18(b) of the Annex (Part 21) to EU Commission Regulation (EC) No. 1702/2003 shall also apply.
