POWERED PARAGLIDERS, POWERED HANG-GLIDERS & SIMILAR POWERED AIRCRAFT

The Irish Aviation Authority (Nationality and Registration of Aircraft) order, 2015 (SI No. 107 of 2015) requires that all manned aircraft operating within the state shall be properly registered either in this State or in an ICAO contracting state with the exception of the following:

- Kites;
- Captive balloons not used for carrying passenger;
- Piloted balloons used exclusively for meteorological purposes;
- Unmanned free balloons without a payload; and
- Gliders with a maximum empty mass of 80 kilogrammes or less.

Where an aircraft comprises a hang-glider, paraglider, parawing, parachute, foil, canopy or other lifting device, and is operated under power, it is not considered a glider and the requirements of the Order apply.

It is an offence to operate such aircraft in the State without being individually registered.

Applications for registration shall be made to the Irish Aviation Authority, The Times Building, 11-12 D'Olier St, Dublin 2, using form AWSD.F.300A which is available on the website: <u>www.iaa.ie</u>.

The following particulars will be provided in the application for the hang-glider, paraglider, parawing, parachute, foil, canopy or other lifting device;

- The name of the manufacturer;
- The name of the type/model;
- The serial number;
- The maximum and minimum weights;
- The surface area; and
- The maximum occupancy.

The assigned Nationality and Registration mark shall be affixed to the hang-glider, paraglider, parawing, parachute, foil, canopy or other lifting device in accordance with the schedule to Article 11 of the Order.

A fireproof plate bearing the assigned nationality mark and registration shall be affixed to the aircraft in accordance with article 11 of the Order.
