# EXEMPTION FOR POWERED PARAGLIDER AIRCRAFT (PPG) and POWERED HANG-GLIDER AIRCRAFT (PHG) ENGAGED IN INSTRUCTION IN FLYING

The Irish Aviation Authority in pursuance of Article 23 of the Irish Aviation Authority (Aerodromes and Visual Ground Aids) Order (S.I. No. 355 of 2008), hereby directs as follows:

Powered Paragliders and Powered Hang-gliders when used for instruction in flying are exempt from the requirement of Article 4 of the Order to use a place which is licensed or otherwise prescribed as suitable under the Order as an aerodrome, provided that:

### Such flights:

- a) are conducted under the responsibility of a Declared National PPG / PHG Flight Training Organisation as detailed in Aeronautical Notice No. P.35;
- b) are conducted at a place where the aircraft may take-off or land without undue hazard to persons or property and in respect of which the owner or occupier of that place shall have given permission for such use;
- c) are appropriately insured for risks to third parties while conducting flight instruction; and
- d) are conducted at a place with access to at least the following safety equipment:
  - (i) a suitable wind-direction indicator that is clearly visible from the air and at ground level from all extremities of the take-off and landing area;
  - (ii) a functioning means of communication to facilitate contact as required with rescue and emergency services; and
  - (iii) on-site fire extinguisher(s) and other rescue and fire-fighting equipment as may be required to ensure the safe conduct of the intended flight operations.

#### **Explanatory Note:**

This direction provides an alleviation for powered paragliders (including powered parachutes, parafoils etc.) and powered hang-gliders, when in use for the purposes of flying instruction, from the requirements of the Order to use a licenced airfield.

**Note:** "aerodrome" is defined in section 2 of the Order.
