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Notes:

1. Aerial Work Services provided by Aerial Work Operators established in the European Union are subject to common European aviation safety regulations administered by the European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) and may provide aerial work services in any European State without further formality.
2. Aerial Work Operators based in third countries (e.g. the UK) are not subject to the same common aviation safety rules as similar operators based in the EU and therefore, such operators cannot conduct commercial aerial work operations within the territories of the EU without formality and in the case of Ireland, such operators require a specific safety permission from the Irish Aviation Authority (IAA).
3. Temporary Aerial Work Permissions are issued for a maximum period of 6 months.
4. The IAA is an aviation safety regulator and therefore can only adjudicate on the aviation safety requirements for the issue of a temporary aerial work permission for third country aerial work operators seeking access to Irish airspace at the request of an Irish entity.
5. It is the responsibility of the Irish entity requesting the third country service to ensure that all other applicable Irish and EU rules (e.g. any applicable procurement of services in the (EU) or work permit requirements are in compliance with applicable regulations).
6. The proposed third country operator will be required to:
 - a) Comply with IAA Aeronautical Notice O.86 which sets out the legal operational requirements for third country aerial work operators.
 - b) Supply the IAA with appropriate manuals and/or other documents as necessary to demonstrate compliance.
 - c) Allow at least 30 working days' notice to allow the IAA time to evaluate the application.
 - d) Fees will be invoiced to the third country operator in accordance with the applicable IAA schedule of charges subject to a minimum fee of €1241 for initial applications.
